

Fact Sheet

The Pinnacle has been a Tampa landmark since its opening in 1975. Built from the post-modern design of well-known architect, Lee Scarfone, his design earned an award from The Florida Architect Magazine in 1976. The developers chose The Pinnacle as the name for two reasons: It was the tallest residential building in Tampa at the time, and it sits on the highest elevation on Bayshore. Its elevation reduces risks of flooding.

- Amenities include:
 - Saltwater, heated pool facing the Bay
 - Two observation decks
 - Two workout rooms
 - Three guest rooms for resident use only at a minimal nightly fee
 - Poolside Community Room equipped with refrigerator and sink
 - \circ $\,$ Game Community Room with bistro tables, ping pong and pool tables, and TV $\,$
 - Social and Meeting Community Room with TV, tables, and full kitchen
 - Private, secure dog park
 - Two car-wash stations
 - On-site recycling
- Parking Above ground and garage level for owners, as well as ample guest spaces
- Security A state-of-the-art security camera system, a biometric access, and regular property patrols provide a safe and secure environment
- Staff
 - Concierge staff from 7am to 11:30pm 7 days a week year-round to patrol the property and support resident needs
 - Full-time maintenance person
 - Full-time cleaning personnel for common areas
- Property Management
 - West Coast Association Management
 - 7-person board
- Reserves Maintain significant financial reserves
